Careers and Transition News

It has been another big year for Careers and Transition in 2013. We have had many opportunities for students to be involved in programs and excursions to aid in developing future plans. Careers and Transition have also taken a further step in developing a website for parents, students and community members to access current information in our school for careers. Year 9 students this year had the opportunity to take part in a program with the NSW Rural Fire Service. We had 13 students graduate from NSW Rural Fire Service Secondary Schools Cadet Program at the end of Term 3. This program gave students an excellent opportunity to develop employability skills such as team work and communication, as well as develop excellent values for future volunteering and community projects.

Cardiff High had a group of students develop competencies in brick and block laying with Newcastle TAFE and the Australian Brick and Block Laying Foundation (ABBTF). The ABBTF bricklaying program went over five days and offered students valuable on-the-job work skills for use in the construction industry. Our students who took part in the program developed works and planned jobs around our school.

Cardiff High School students undergoing School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships this year had many success stories. Some of our SBAT students transferred into full apprenticeships. Our star School Based Trainee this year Riley Parkinson won the Careerlinks School Based Trainee of the year for her role with Hunter New England Local Health. School based apprenticeships have the opportunity to develop skills on the job while working towards achieving a vocational qualification as part of their HSC.

Cardiff students have also participated in the following programs and courses this year Careerlinks Hunter Career EXPO, Yakka Day, Participation Pathways that Work, The Employability Passport Program, Work Experience, Construction Safety Training Induction course, First Aid courses and Year 11 Study Skills program to name a few.

Congratulations to all year 10 students who participated in their SCOPE interviews, students were interviewed by a panel consisting of a community member, teacher and a year 9 student in a formal interview based on their learning throughout the year.


